Odyssey God Family Problems

- I. Struggle for Athens
 - A. Cecrops was the King of Cecropia
 - B. He wanted to have a patron god/goddess for the city
 - C. Athena and Poseidon competed for patronage
 - 1. Poseidon made a small salt-water pool called Erechtheus
 - a) Not super significant, just a lame pool
 - 2. Athena planted an olive tree
 - a) Significant because Athenian soil is bad
 - 3. Athena won, and Poseidon resented her for it
 - a) Poseidon, in his rage, flooded Athens for a day

II. The blinding of Polyphemus

- A. Polyphemus is the son of Poseidon
 - 1. Mother is Thoosa
 - 2. Lived on the isle of the Cyclopes (Sicily)
- B. Odysseus lands on Sicily
 - 1. He does this because his men are hungry, and there are cattle on the island
- C. Odysseus' men enter the cave of Polyphemus
 - 1. Odysseus asks them not to touch anything
 - 2. His men touch everything, and specifically eat his cheese

- D. Polyphemus returns to the cave
 - 1. He kills some of Odysseus' men and leaves them there
 - 2. He blocks the remainder of Odysseus' men in the cave to find their ship
- E. Odysseus and his men blind the cyclops for their escape
 - 1. They heat up an olive branch
 - 2. When Polyphemus returns the men altogether poke the cyclops' one eye
 - 3. No cyclopes help Polyphemus as Odysseus says his name is "nobody"
 - a) Polyphemus shouts "nobody is attacking me" and so the other cyclopes are confused and do not help
- F. Odysseus and his men escape
 - 1. They hide underneath the cattle that Polyphemus herds
- G. Odysseus taunts the Cyclops, telling him his real name
- H. Polyphemus prays to Poseidon and wishes that Odysseus never reaches home
 - 1. He also says that if Odysseus must return home, he should return a broken man with no crew remaining

II. Poseidon vs Athena in the Odyssey

- A. Athena constantly complains about Poesidon
 - 1. Begs Zeus to have pity on Odysseus
 - a) Stop Poesidon and his rage
- B. Poseidon annihalates Odysseus' crew off the shores of Phaeacia
 - 1. Athena once again interferes with Poseidon's plan and saves Odysseus
 - a) Sends him to Phaecia
 - b) Recieved wamly
 - c) Is supplied a ship to go home

C. Resolution

- 1. Odysseus returns home to ithaca a broken man
 - a) All his crew is dead
- 2. Poseidon gives up his rage and allows this
 - a) Specifically he calms while Odysseus in Phaeacia
 - b) Also when Odysseus sacrifices to Poseidon as Tiresias said
- 3. Both Poseidon and Athena are satisfied with this conclusion
 - a) Their resentment still remains

III. Characters

- A. Odysseus
 - 1. Warrior from Ithaca
 - 2. Fights in Trojan War
 - 3. Struggles to sail home due to Poseidon's anger
 - a) Blinding Polyphemus

B. Athena

- 1. Goddess of wisdom
- 2. Leads Odysseus home
 - a) Admires his cunning
 - b) Goes against the wishes of Poseidon

C. Posiedon

- 1. God of sea
- 2. Father of Polyphemus
- 3. Sends obstacles to prevent Odysseus from arriving home
 - a) Angry at Odysseus for blinding his son

D. Polyphemus

- 1. Cyclops (has one eye)
- 2. Son of Poseidon
- 3. Blinded by Odysseus

E. The Crew of Odysseus

- 1. Bad decision making skills result in longer journey home
- F. Tiresias
 - 1. Prophet
 - 2. Tells Odysseus what to do to satisfy Posiedon
 - a) Sacrifice a ram and bull to Posiedon when he returns homeward

IV. Locations

- A. Athens
 - 1. Place where the olive tree and Erechtheus were made
 - 2. The beginning of Athena and Poseidon's feud
- B. Troy
 - 1. Where Odysseus starts his story
- C. Isle of the Cyclops (Sicily)
 - 1. Where Polyphemus lives
 - 2. Where Odysseus lands and pokes Polyphemus' eye out
- D. Phaeacia
 - 1. Main place where Odysseus was punished by Poseidon
- E. Calypso's Island
 - 1. Where Odysseus was kept by Poseidon's will
 - 2. Zeus let him stay there, but Athena was the one who suggested he leave
- F. Ithaca
 - 1. Odysseus' homeland, and Athena's main goal
